




About People in Need

People in Need (PIN) was established in 1992 in the Czech Republic and has since grown to become one of the largest non-profit organisations in Central and Eastern Europe. In addition to humanitarian aid and development cooperation, PIN also works in the fields of human rights, education and social inclusion, both abroad as well as in the Czech Republic.

In the 1990s, PIN's primary focus was delivering humanitarian assistance to people affected by conflict. Over time, PIN began to deal with longer-term problems in developing countries such as the shortage of safe water, food insecurity, environmental degradation, and restricted access to quality education and health services. PIN's Relief and Development Department helps people in emergencies, both in wartime crises and areas affected by natural disasters, and also assists people in places where it is difficult to break out of the vicious circle of poverty without external support.

Operating in over twenty countries, PIN carries out over 80 million Euros-worth of projects every year, which supports hundreds of thousands of people suffering from crisis, conflict and poverty.



Sectors we work in

PIN's programming is carefully designed and evidence-based, combining in-depth contextual analyses, formative research and effective behavioural change strategies to ensure real differences can be made. PIN believes that interventions should be multisectoral and engage all stakeholders in order to achieve long-term positive change.

Emergency Preparedness & Response



Complex emergencies and conflicts are affecting increasing numbers of people, with many crises becoming protracted and requiring prolonged interventions. PIN continues to provide assistance to people affected by conflict and facing forced displacement in Syria, Ukraine, Iraq, Afghanistan, Bangladesh and DRC. PIN also provides timely and resilience-building support to the victims of natural disasters, such as droughts in Ethiopia, flooding in Cambodia and Afghanistan, earthquakes in Nepal, typhoons in the Philippines or extreme winters in Mongolia.

Good Governance




In countries undergoing political, social and economic transition, governments can lack transparency in their decision-making and, as a result, be plagued by corruption and fail to provide their citizens with access to basic services. To support a more open democratic process, PIN focuses on engaging citizens in local decision-making and encourages effective cooperation among civil society, governments and communities. PIN builds the capacity of both civil society organisations and local authorities while empowering citizens to voice their needs, advocate for local issues and influence policy-making processes.

Sustainable Livelihoods & Environment



More than three quarters of people living in extreme poverty are in rural areas and nearly two thirds earn a living from agriculture. These people often face key challenges including low agricultural productivity, lack of access to markets and employment opportunities, gender disparities and environmental problems, such as soil degradation and climate change. To overcome these challenges, PIN adopts a systems approach that involves working in partnership with communities, civil society, governments and businesses to drive inclusive change. This includes, for example, improving long-term access to the skills, products and services that can increase the income, nutritional security and resilience of farming communities, while reducing the adverse impacts of agricultural production on the environment.

Social Inclusion & Protection

Virtually everywhere, there are individuals and groups who face barriers preventing them from fully participating socially, economically or politically. Women and girls belong to the largest groups who are discriminated against and often socially excluded. Conflicts and disasters make millions of people extremely vulnerable, leaving them without protection and the means to cope. PIN believes in ensuring that vulnerable people and groups are not marginalised and socially excluded. To this end, PIN builds the capacity of governments and civil society to help them develop sustainable social protection systems and services, and empowers marginalised people so that they may have equal say and opportunities. During times of crisis, PIN strives to protect vulnerable groups who may be placed at greater risk.


Education & Skills

Not every child can attend school despite their indisputable right to education. In many countries, school attendance is denied to children due to armed conflict, poverty, humanitarian disasters or simply due to gender-related, ethnic or medical discrimination. PIN strives to tackle these challenges and provide quality and inclusive education to all children. Through vocational education and training in entrepreneurship and other skills, PIN supports young people to establish businesses, find jobs and act as agents of change to build a more transparent and accountable society.









says Fahim, from Herat province in Afghanistan. Fahim attended a vocational training, which was part of a project funded by the European Union and the Czech Development Agency that supported the economic and social integration of displaced people and host communities. After completing the electrical skills training, Fahim set up a workshop at his house and has been running it with his friend ever since. Together, they fix their neighbours' electrical problems and earn a living. "We are really proud of being helpful for them. We make almost 200 AFA per day and it's a good start," says Fahim.
