

INTEGRATED PROGRAMMING FOR IMPROVED NUTRITION



People in Need's approach to nutrition – **Integrated Programming for Improved Nutrition (IPIN)** – is based on the recognition that well-designed, **multi-sectoral programs** addressing the **key causes of undernutrition** simultaneously are essential for fighting poverty and strengthening people's resilience.

By employing a range of **proven nutrition-specific and nutrition-sensitive interventions**, we aim to reduce the prevalence of undernutrition in poor parts of Africa and Asia.

Our focus on the nutrition of pregnant and lactating women and children under two ensures that we address the most critical period of children's lives – **the first 1,000 days**.

Our teams use their existing expertise in the food security, WASH and health sectors while partnering with relevant, additional value-delivering governmental institutions, non-profit agencies and the private sector.

We **welcome cooperation** with other like-minded implementing agencies and donors.



PEOPLE IN NEED (PIN) HAS A MULTI-YEAR TRACK RECORD OF IMPLEMENTING NUTRITION-SPECIFIC AND NUTRITION-SENSITIVE PROJECTS IN SEVERAL PRIORITY COUNTRIES:

In **Ethiopia**, PIN partners with its Alliance2015 partner Concern Worldwide to implement a multi-sectoral program focusing on reducing undernutrition and increasing people's resilience in draught-prone areas.

In the **Czech Republic**, PIN raises awareness of solutions for decreasing undernutrition in the world and advocates for increased political commitment and financial support.

In **Afghanistan**, PIN included addressing undernutrition into its urban poverty program and is exploring possibilities for further integrations.

In **Syria**, PIN provided specifically targeted food aid and vitamin supplements to over 30,000 families with pregnant women and young children.

In **Cambodia**, PIN expanded its health system strengthening work by developing a mobile-phone based voice messaging system raising caretakers' awareness on essential nutrition practices.

In **DR Congo and Angola**, PIN's Community-Based Management of Acute Malnutrition Programs complemented by prevention-oriented interventions reached over 250,000 children.
