

People in Need (PIN) believes that effective agricultural extension services, benefiting both poorer and better-off farmers, are crucial for improving food and nutrition security in rural Ethiopia. Since 2011, PIN has supported Woreda Agricultural Offices (WAO) in SNNP Region in strengthening the quality of services provided by Agricultural Extension Workers and community-level Farmer Training Centres (FTCs). PIN's material, technical and management support has enabled extension workers to offer a wider range of services, train more farmers, double the type of demonstrated crops and increase FTCs' financial sustainability.

Through intensive cooperation with existing actors and structures, PIN has demonstrably improved the food security of local farmers, focusing on the most vulnerable. Solid **evidence of the main benefits** is available: according to commissioned evaluation, farmers have started applying better agricultural practices and 94% of them grow a greater variety of crops.

As of March 2015, 167,241 people have benefited from PIN support financed by the Czech Development Agency and Czech citizens. Since PIN's main emphasis is on **supporting the implementation of promising Government strategies**, all its work is done with the agreement of, and in close cooperation with, the relevant authorities.

PIN Ethiopia's Program Strategy for 2015-2020 is designed to take full advantage of the expertise generated so far and further scale up those types of assistance which have achieved the best results to date. In doing so, **PIN welcomes cooperation** with like-minded agencies, institutions and donors.

The total financial value of its assistance has been over 20 million USD so far, funded primarily by the Czech Development Agency, the European Commission and private donors.
